MINUTES Golf Advisory Board Meeting

5:15 PM - Wednesday, October 26, 2022 Parks and Recreation Conference Room, 500 E. 3rd Street

The Golf Advisory Board of Loveland, CO was called to order on Wednesday, October 26, 2022, at 5:15 PM, in the Parks and Recreation Conference Room, 500 E. 3rd Street, with the following members present:

1. CALL TO ORDER

Chair Beth Soderquist called the meeting to order at 5:15 PM.

2. ADOPTION OF MINUTES

2.1 The September 28, 2022, minutes were unanimously approved as submitted.

3. CITIZENS REPORT

No citizens present.

4. COUNCIL LIAISON REPORT

Councilor McFall updated the Board on recent Council topics including:

- Approval of the Dry Creek bridge.
- Approval of the City's Budget Plan.
- Move to stop contracting with the Larimer Humane Society, as the costs have been significantly increasing. Council is hoping for Larimer County to reassess these costs.

5. ACTION OR DISCUSSION ITEMS

5.1 2023 Golf Advisory Board Work Plan

Andrea Sheldon presented the Board with the revised Work Plan priorities. Beth Soderquist motioned to approve; motion seconded by David Spangler with unanimous approval.

5.2 Policies, Operating Rules, Guidelines and Standards Review

Golf Manager Mark Esoda and Andrea Sheldon opened the topic. Potential revisions for 2023 were pointed out and discussed by the Board, including 5 policy changes that were proposed by Staff.

Noted changes are as follows:

• Offering only 18-hole tee times from the first tee during Peak Times. A

limited number of 9-hole tee times from the 10th hole will be made available at the discretion of the Head Golf Professional.

- No-Show Fee: Customers who accumulate more than 10 no-shows for reserved tee times will be charged a no-show fee of \$10.00 per player. Additional no-show fees will be charged for every no-show thereafter until the end of the year, when no-show accounts are reset to zero. Customers may be prevented from reserving any additional tee times until all charges have been paid.
- Shot Guns: A minimum of 72 golfers will be required for a shot gun format for an outing event during Peak Times. An outing event numbering less than 72 golfers will be booked as a tee time format event.
- Eliminate the requirement of one bag per golfer unless speed of play issues become apparent.
- Associations, leagues, or others having pre-blocked tee times must provide a list of participants to the Pro Shop 7 days in advance of the play date. Tee times not having participant names associated will be released to the general inventory for tee time reservations to be made by the public.

Beth Soderquist motioned to approve the 2023 Policies, Operating Rules, Guidelines and Standards with the suggested noted changes; motion seconded by Denise Rhoades with unanimous approval.

6. NON-ACTION OR INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

Property and Programs Update

Mark Esoda discussed the following property and programs topics:

- Olde Course Clubhouse Update: There is another small delay on the HVAC unit, and the shipping date is now expected to be December 6th. Given that the clubhouse is unable to open without this HVAC unit, Staff is, now, looking at mid-December for the estimated clubhouse opening. There will be additional fees to extend the construction contract, along with extending the dates for the trailer, storage pods, and Port-A-Johns; however, costs are still within the budget. There will most likely be a "soft opening" with a larger opening event in the Spring. Anybody who is interested in touring the new clubhouse can speak with Doug, the Head Golf Professional.
- Staff met with Cultural Services staff last week to request that the required contribution of "1% to the Arts" be used for The Olde Course Clubhouse project. A follow-up meeting with the Cultural Services Board is scheduled for November 3rd during which, Golf will present ideas on possible locations for the art. Cultural Services will coordinate the request for proposals for the art.
- Golf Course Architect Rick Phelps toured all 3 Loveland golf course properties with the course superintendents and Mark. Together, they identified potential maintenance projects including bunker renovation, debris removal, new mowing patterns, tree removals & additions, and dredging lakes.
- 4-acre feet of water was added to the pond on Hole #13 at Mariana Butte; Staff will monitor future levels for any needed additions.
- A Parks and Recreation Department Master Plan Meeting is scheduled for November 29th from 5:00 PM – 7:30 PM at the Rialto. Board

members will receive a formal invitation soon.

- Andrea passed out a sheet titled 'Instruction Offerings 2022' that highlighted the adult and youth golf programs and classes that were offered throughout the progression of this year.
- Cart Leases the estimated cart delivery date is July 4th, 2023.
- There is potential for a new flooring project at the Cattail Creek clubhouse, along with new TV monitors and a new sound system.
- Seasonal Pass Applications, Private Cart Registration Forms and Golf Outing contracts will soon be amended with a "theft and disorderly conduct" clause addressing the ongoing removal of range balls from the course. The Olde Course recently got new range balls delivered, and 1800 range balls disappeared within the first 4 days.
- Applications for the 2023 Golf Advisory Board are due by Monday, October 31st.

7. STAFF REPORTS

Andrea Sheldon gave a verbal update on YTD expenditures and revenues.

8. BOARD MEMBER COMMENTS

Will Parker: Are we able to get sand bottles on the par 3s at The Olde Course? Beth Soderquist: Thank you to everyone for an efficient review of the Policies & Procedures. Also want to say thank you to the 3 Board members whose terms are up for their time and service!

9. ADJOURN

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:45 PM.

B. The purpose of the golf advisory board shall be to serve as an advisory body to the city council and to assist the department of parks and recreation in matters pertaining to golf and the municipal golf courses for the common benefit of the city, its golf courses, and the golfing public.
